## Public Humanities Grants - RFP COMMUNITY PROJECT GRANTS

#### **OVERVIEW**

Humanities Montana's Community Project Grants are awarded to nonprofit organizations and public institutions across Montana to support public humanities programming that strengthens vibrant communities and cultures, promotes civic engagement, sparks thoughtful community dialogue, and reflects on the human experience across the Big Sky State. These grants are designed to support a vast array of bold and innovative projects that are meaningful to local communities and inspire timely community conversations – from film screenings and panel discussions to cultural festivals and youth literacy programs and much more.

#### **AWARD**

\$2,000 to \$10,000 - 1:1 matching funds required

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

Nonprofit organizations, accredited institutions of higher education, state or local government or one of their agencies (schools, libraries, museums, etc.), federally recognized Native American Tribal governments, and tribal organizations. A Unique Entity ID (UEI) and Federal Tax ID (EIN) are required to apply. Learn more about eligibility in the grant guidelines.

Project Start Date: no earlier than Oct 1

#### **Grant Term:**

30 days after completing all project activities and up to 1 year

**Award Notification:** 

October 15
