

OVERVIEW

Humanities Montana's **Community Project Grants** are awarded to nonprofit organizations and public institutions across Montana to support public humanities programming that strengthens vibrant communities and cultures, promotes civic engagement, sparks thoughtful community dialogue, and reflects on the human experience across the Big Sky State. These grants are designed to support a vast array of bold and innovative projects that are meaningful to local communities and inspire timely community conversations – from film screenings and panel discussions to cultural festivals and youth literacy programs and much more.

AWARD

\$2,000 to \$10,000 – 1:1 matching funds required

ELIGIBILITY

Private nonprofit organizations; institutions of higher education; state, local, and federally recognized Native American tribal governments; and groups of persons that form an association to carry out a project. A Unique Entity ID (SAM.gov) and Federal Tax ID (EIN) are required to apply.
