

### OVERVIEW

Humanities Montana's Speakers in the Schools program supports public humanities programming in classrooms through its statewide speaker's bureau. With Speakers in the Schools, trained facilitators and experts lead students in workshops and conversations on topics like current affairs, untold histories, native cultures, literature, and more. Teachers can work with speakers to tailor programs to varying degrees to suit classroom needs. Speakers in the Schools presentations support public humanities efforts with programs for all classrooms across Montana.

Humanities Montana pays Speakers in the Schools speakers an honorarium, and reimburses travel costs including food, lodging and mileage expenses for each program presentation. Speakers in the Schools programs are free to all schools and homeschool groups that participate with the program.

### ELIGIBILITY

Public K-12 Schools, homeschool groups, and private schools are eligible to apply for Speakers in the Schools programs. A Unique Entity ID (UEI) and Federal Tax ID (EIN) is not required but strongly encouraged to apply.

Speakers in the Schools programs are for students, teachers and school administrators only. Speakers in the Schools programs are not open to the public.

### DEADLINES

Rolling Application Deadline (dependent on funding availability). Applications can be submitted anytime, and are reviewed daily.
